Community Discussion: Chatham County 2050, August 15, 3 p.m., Chatham Rabbit, Siler City

Chatham County has surpassed 80,000 residents. We will rapidly exceed 100,000 as approved economic and residential development plans are completed across the county. This event asks residents to engage in structured discussion with each other to jointly envision the high quality of life we want for Chatham County in 2050. Here's some background to consider:

- Since 2017, Plan Chatham's strategic vision includes diverse goals like these: foster a healthy community, preserve Chatham's rural character, provide infrastructure for economic development and compact growth in cities and dense areas, ensure equitable housing and education, and conserve natural resources.
- The county's Unified Development Ordinance is nearing completion, TriRiver Water will serve growth needs in Siler City, and Pittsboro is seeking satellite annexation authority to better manage growth and environmental issues.
- The conversation occurs as communities nationwide consider ways to reduce social and economic poverty, bridge urban-rural differences (many perceived), and build resilient communities.

Excitement and momentum grow for Kamala Harris with record fundraising and growing support

When Vice President Harris entered the race on July 21st, and our North Carolina DNC delegation <u>made national news</u> by becoming the first battleground state to have their delegates unanimously support her bid for President, this race has entered a different stratosphere with recording breaking fundraising and a newfound excitement that we haven't seen since President Obama's 2008 campaign.

In the first 24 hours Kamala Harris raised \$81 million, breaking the record for the highest 24-hour fundraising haul of any presidential candidate in history.

The campaign said it brought in more than 888,000 contributions from individual grassroots donors, 60 percent of whom had not donated before in the 2024 cycle. Vice President Harris raised over \$200 Million in less than a week, with two-thirds coming from first time donors.

Over 170,000 new volunteers joined Team Harris since the announcement.

The past week also saw virtual events like "Win With Black Women" raise \$1.5 million in three hours, "White Women: Answer the Call" raised over \$11 million, and "White Dudes for Harris" call raised more than \$4 million. The way the calls came together quickly and raised millions caught the attention of both voters and reporters with CNN's Abby Phillip saying "zoom calls raising more money than fundraising events is one of the most fascinating stories of the last few weeks." "White Women: Answer the Call" reportedly broke the record for the highest attendance of any Zoom call, with a reported 200,000 attendees.

On top of the record-breaking fundraising, a new poll shows Harris has gained ground against Trump in six of the seven swing states since Joe Biden dropped out of the presidential race. Conducted on July 24-28, the Bloomberg News/Morning Consult poll of registered voters shows Harris leading Trump in Arizona, Wisconsin and Nevada, with a two-point advantage in each, and leading in Michigan by 11 percentage points.

There were 10,000 fired up supporters in the crowd at her Tuesday night Atlanta rally – the campaign's largest rally to date

In North Carolina alone there were 7,000 online sign-ups to volunteer for the campaign which was a 3000% increase from the previous week.

Nearly 50 percent of volunteers who signed up this week are new to the campaign.

Next week, Kamala Harris and her VP pick will be coming to Raleigh!

Unclaimed Property

Unclaimed property consists of bank accounts, wages, utility deposits, insurance policy proceeds, stocks, bonds, and contents of safe deposit boxes that typically have been abandoned for one to five years. Funds become unclaimed because the company loses track of the consumer, due to an incorrect address or other missing information.

By law, these funds are escheated, or turned over, to the Department of State Treasurer for safekeeping. As new funds are added, the NC Cash database is updated, which means that your name could be listed right now. Check
