Presidential Debate Watch Party — June 27 @ 8 p.m. in Raleigh

Fair maps: North Carolina Republicans are now claiming that it's impossible to define what "fair" means, so that means there's <u>no such thing as "fair elections."</u> Y'all, that shakes the foundations of our very democracy. We have to let folks know we demand a legislature elected by the people, not with legislators choosing their electorate.

SCOTUS Strikes Down Ban on Bump Stocks

The conservative majority on the Supreme Court ruled 6-3 to strike down the Trump-era ban on bump stocks

The ban, which went into effect in 2019, came after a gunman, who used semiautomatic rifles equipped with the accessories, killed 60 people at a Las Vegas music festival in one of the deadliest mass shootings in modern U.S. history.

Bump stocks allow a shooter to convert a semi-automatic rifle into a weapon that can fire hundreds of rounds a minute.

Senator Martin Heinrich (D-NM) is introducing a bill in the Senate to ban bump stocks but it's expected to be blocked by the Senate Republicans.

Senator Chris Murphy (D-CT) says the Supreme Court seems poised "to fundamentally rewrite" the Second Amendment with this reversal

States like Illinois, who have enacted a state law banning bump stocks, have said that their law will stay in place despite the ruling by the Supreme Court.

Statement from Chair Clayton

"This ruling by the Supreme Court is shameful and horrifying. Bump stocks increase an AR-15's rate of fire from 180 rounds per minute to 400-800 rounds per minute. They inflict mass carnage by allowing the gunman to shoot automatically, without pulling the trigger. I'm terrified by what the Supreme Court's decision today could lead to."

NCDP Chair Anderson Clayton Statement on Republican Infighting Over Budget

"North Carolina taxpayers shouldn't have their money caught up in Republican political theater. This sham proposed House budget is not only a sign of the Republican leadership's inability to govern, the money in it shows the wrong priorities. Half a billion dollars of taxpayer funds should not go to a private school voucher scheme that benefits only the wealthiest in North Carolina. This is yet another example of Republicans putting politics and their own power over the people."

<u>District 20 Updates from NC State Senator Natalie Murdock (Highlights)</u>

Black Maternal Health Day of Action!

The House and Senate have spent the past several months at a standstill over budget disagreements, and unfortunately, despite the amount of time and effort my colleagues devoted to budget adjustments, the outcome is not at all what North Carolinians deserve.

Both the House and Senate versions of the budget fail to make the necessary investments in public education and childcare centers we need to improve teacher retention and ensure parents have access to quality early childhood education.

The budget also continues the trend of taking taxpayer dollars and diverting them to private schools through the general assembly's voucher program without any attempt to ensure that these private institutions are held to the same educational standards as public schools.

Governor Cooper Signs Four Bills and Vetoes One

Today, Governor Roy Cooper signed the following bills into law:

- Senate Bill 124: Predatory Roofing/Ins. Rebate Reform.
- House Bill 1020: Retirement Admin. Changes Act of 2024.
- House Bill 989: Retirement Service Purchase Rewrite Part III.
- House Bill 988: 2024 Retirement Technical Corrections.

Governor Cooper made the following statement on his signing of SB 124:

"This bipartisan legislation is an important step to provide necessary protections for North Carolinians and helps ensure that residents across the state are protected from unethical businesses which prey upon vulnerable people, particularly after storms when they need help the most."

Today, Governor Roy Cooper vetoed the following bill:

House Bill 237: <u>Various Criminal and Election Law Changes.</u>

Governor Cooper made the following statement on his veto of HB 237:

"This legislation creates a gaping loophole for secret, unlimited campaign money in the middle of an election year. While voters are kept in the dark, this scheme allows anonymous out-of-state billionaires to flood North Carolina with campaign contributions to rescue extreme right-wing candidates that Republicans now fear will lose. The legislation also removes protections and threatens criminal charges for people who want to protect their health by wearing a mask."

Discharge Petition – Right To Use Contraception

I introduced a discharge petition for <u>Senate Bill 808 - The Right to Use</u> <u>Contraception Act</u>. This petition, if successful, would mean this bill would be taken out of committee and go straight to the floor for a vote. This decision was made in light of threats to contraceptive access in other states. We have seen other states threaten access to IUDs and emergency contraceptives and it is paramount that North Carolina establish protections that preserve our right to contraceptives.

Black Maternal Health Day of Action Advocacy Meetings

Our advocates had a productive conversation with Rep. Kristin Baker MD about MOMnibus 2.5, and the importance of addressing disparities in black maternal health care. I greatly appreciate Rep. Baker for taking time out of her extremely busy schedule to welcome these Black maternal health advocates and listen to their stories.

To kick off Black Maternal Health Day of Action, I had the chance to welcome all our advocates to the General Assembly and thank them for the hard work they do to address this important issue. I learned more about each of their connections to the issue of inequity seen in black maternal healthcare, and why they are committed to this cause. I am very grateful that I had this time to speak to the advocates and that they joined us in lifting up this critical issue.

Thank you all for your time, and your hard work. I could not do the work I do in the maternal health space without all of your hard work.
