Rate Hike Mike - Current Republican Commissioner for State Insurance, Mike Causey, has really shown a light on how lower ballot elections can have serious implications for North Carolinians. [Sixteen times, Mike chose to approve rate hikes that affected everyone in North Carolina](#) without holding a public hearing to ensure we were informed about these decisions. Mike's time in office has been rife with conflicts between his own party members and he has taken money from the very insurance companies that he should have an adversarial relationship with – not an employer-style relationship. We deserve someone who works for the people of North Carolina, not the corporations looking to take advantage of us.

NCGA Republicans Funneling Millions More in Taxpayer Money from Public Schools to Private School Vouchers for the Wealthy

- The Republican majority in the North Carolina Senate and House passed a newly revised bill that provides more funding for school vouchers
- House Bill 10 includes a voucher measure that will allow more families to take advantage of the voucher program and **calls for \$248 million in nonrecurring funds for Opportunity Scholarships** for all students attending private schools. Then, an additional \$215 million in recurring funds.
- Based on an updated analysis by the Office of State Budget and Management, if the General Assembly fully expands the taxpayer-funded private school voucher program, private schools could siphon nearly **\$100 million in state funding from public schools** *just in the first full year* of the program. In addition, the expansion of the voucher program will cost the state \$277 million in new spending just in the first year.
- **Expanding private school vouchers would disproportionately impact rural North Carolina counties**, where access to private education is limited and public schools serve as the backbone of communities. More than one-quarter (28) of North Carolina's counties – all rural counties – have no or just one private school participating in the voucher program. By diverting public funds to wealthier urban areas, private school vouchers are deepening the resource gap and undermining the educational opportunities for rural students.

- Private schools that receive vouchers are not regulated and are not accountable to taxpayers despite receiving taxpayer money. Vouchers cover tuition for schools that don't have to report how students are performing, don't have to serve all students regardless of race, gender, socioeconomic status or religious beliefs or don't have to hire licensed teachers.
- In addition, many of the state's **top private schools don't accept state vouchers**, meaning students are not afforded new opportunities at the best schools. Instead, the schools that do participate often **exclude certain students from attending and frequently do not meet key quality metrics**.
- Public schools that serve more than 84% of students are continuously asked to do more with less. North Carolina ranks near the bottom of all states in K-12 funding, spending nearly **\$5,000 less per student** than the national average. Our state is falling behind nationally in teacher pay, dropping in the **most recent rankings to 38th**.

Statement from Chair Clayton on HB10:

“Republicans just voted to rob public schools of hundreds of millions more in taxpayer dollars and funnel it into private school vouchers for billionaires to send their children to private schools. Instead of giving our teachers an overdue pay raise or finally passing a budget, Republicans prioritized lining the pockets of the private school industry. This is a slap in the face for our teachers, rural communities, and the children of North Carolina who have a constitutional right to a sound, basic education.”

NCDP Chair Statement on Michele Morrow's Latest Homophobic and Disturbing Comment

North Carolina Democratic Party Chair Anderson Clayton released the following statement:

“Michele Morrow is dangerous. She is actively bullying children and she's creating unsafe environments. This is the rhetoric of a hateful homophobic dark web internet troll who should never be in a position to oversee the education of North Carolina students. Not only does she not have any experience to oversee this department but with 49 days left in the election it is also truly disturbing that she thinks this is a winning message.”

Statement from NCDP Chair Anderson Clayton

North Carolina Democratic Party Chair Anderson Clayton shared the following statement on reporting about Mark Robinson, who Trump has endorsed and supported throughout the campaign:

“Donald Trump hand-picked Mark Robinson, uplifted his campaign, and has been on the trail espousing their extreme agenda with him as recently as late August. This November, North Carolinians will reject Donald Trump, Mark Robinson, and NC MAGA Republicans' extreme, divisive agenda and bring our state forward.”

State of the Race – Messaging Guidance

The NC Republican Party is officially stuck with Mark Robinson as their nominee for Governor and he is the face of the NCGOP.

- With midnight being the last possible chance to remove Mark Robinson, and polls showing disaster in November, Republicans spent yesterday trying to get ahead of the CNN report as a last-ditch effort to pressure Robinson to drop out. The GOP used Republican publications like Carolina Journal to leak how bad the CNN story would be with the headline “Robinson under pressure to withdraw from gubernatorial race”.
- The damning CNN report yesterday highlighted disturbing messages and past comments that Robison made on a porn website. The report highlights how Robinson referred to himself as a ‘black NAZI!’, admitted to peeping on girls in the shower, said he’d like to buy slaves, and attacked civil rights leader Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., calling him a “commie bastard,” “worse than a maggot,” a “ho f**king, phony,” and a “huckster.”

Statement from Josh Stein:

"North Carolinians already know Mark Robinson is completely unfit to be Governor. Josh remains focused on winning this campaign so that together we can build a safer, stronger North Carolina for everyone."

Statement from Governor Cooper:

"Donald Trump and NC GOP leaders embraced Mark Robinson for years knowing who he was and what he stood for including disrespect for women and inciting violence. They reap what they sow."

Statement from Chair Anderson Clayton:

“A reminder: Republicans running for office in North Carolina have endorsed Mark Robinson and his extreme agenda. He belongs nowhere near the Governor's office and we have the chance to deny him the opportunity to ever represent the people of this great state again in November.”

- The NCGOP offered their full support late last night when they realized Robinson was not going to step aside.
- For years, **the NCGOP has stood behind Mark Robinson. From his first national debut making fun of the Parkland children in Florida to denying the Holocaust, calling it “hogwash.” And yesterday was no**

different: the NCGOP doubled down, defended, and deflected for Mark Robinson.

- Yesterday, Republicans quickly scrubbed photos of Mark Robinson from their social media accounts while publicly vowing to stand beside him.
- Senator Tillis even seemed to suggest the race is over in his post on x, stating “It was a tough day, but we must stay focused on the races we can win.”
- **Democrats have the most qualified slate of candidates ever this cycle.** Meanwhile, Mark Robinson and this slate of down ballot candidates are too extreme and do not represent North Carolina.
- North Carolinians know how dangerous Mark Robinson is and every Republican candidate on the ballot would support and help implement Mark Robinson’s agenda if he was elected.
- It’ll be experience vs. extremism on the ballot and voters have a clear choice in every race this November.

Here are some great examples of how our Dem candidates have hit their opponents for their support of Mark Robinson:

Braxton Winston hit his opponent Luke Farley on X by using screenshots of deleted pictures with the caption:

“Hey Luke Farley, why did you delete all of your social media posts with Mark Robinson?”

Congressman Jeff Jackson for example utilized Dan Bishop’s past comments in his post on X:

“My opponent for Attorney General is Dan Bishop. Here are some things he's said about Mark Robinson:

“I'm a big fan of Mark Robinson. I endorsed him out of the gate and he and I are very close friends.”

“I know that the AG's position in North Carolina, as I've said, might be more important than governor. It's essential to have Mark Robinson with a sidekick.”

Robinson “demonstrated himself to be a thoughtful and learned student of history, and he brought a fresh perspective.”

“He is without exception the most formidable candidate I’ve ever seen in North Carolina and now he’s ready to become Governor.”

“I’m with Mark Robinson. More than ever. And all the way to the end.”

Kamala Harris HQ also joined the trend by posting a pic of Donald Trump with Mark Robinson on X with the caption “Best Friends” with a heart emoji.

Republican Council of State Candidates Refuse to Speak Out, Continuing Close Association With Mark Robinson

In the wake of the [CNN report](#) that Mark Robinson referred to himself as a “black nazi” and posted other disturbing sentiments on a porn website, none of the Republican Council of State candidates have condemned him.

Instead, the Republican candidates have remained silent and some have tried to delete their previous photos with Mark Robinson on their social media [including Luke Farley, running for Labor Commissioner](#).

“Mark Robinson and every Republican running for our Council of State are too extreme for North Carolina. Their silence speaks volumes to voters across our state, who know that not only are they sticking with Robinson, but that they will fully support and help implement his agenda if elected,” **said NCDP Chair Anderson Clayton**. “As we move quickly towards the first votes being cast, folks across our state will remember this moment and they will see that the choice is clear — our candidates are bringing experience to the ballot while Republicans are bringing extremism.”

Senator Rachel Hunt, Democratic Nominee for Lieutenant Governor: “With Mark Robinson & Hal Weatherman running proudly as a ticket, voters are already seeing my opponent in lockstep with Robinson's anti-abortion agenda. Hal Weatherman even says himself that Mark Robinson's heart is in the right place. Every one of our Council of State races is crucial for the future of our state. We must send a message that this is not who we are and we are not going back.”

Braxton Winston, Democratic Nominee for Labor Commissioner: “Mark Robinson is too extreme for North Carolina. He is the highest elected Republican in our state and the culture of extremism he fosters runs through the entire slate of the Republican candidates this year. My opponent can delete his photos with Robinson, but he can’t delete the contribution to his campaign or endorsement of his extreme agenda.”
